


**An introduction to our Eight Points**

Our Eight Points offer a kind of framework to direct our thinking about progressive Christianity. We acknowledge that there are many other ways of understanding Christian faith but hope these Eight Points might be helpful.

They are meant to be inclusive, and not to impose uniformity. Points 2–8 are an attempt to spell out the broad consequences of being ‘guided by the life and teachings of Jesus’ (Point 1).

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**PCN Britain offers these eight points, not as a creed, but as an expression of the Christian life.**

**seek God, however understood, guided by the life and teachings of Jesus**
